

Dear NREMT provider,



As the current national EMS recertification season begins, we wanted to remind those of you who are affected by the EMT-Basic to EMT transition or the EMT-Paramedic to Paramedic (NRP) transition. As announced in 2011, those EMT-Basics (or EMT-Paramedics) expiring March 31, 2016, are required to submit proof of a state-approved transition course to the NREMT in order to recertify and transition to the EMT (or NRP) level. You must submit proof of a transition with your recertification application.

Recertification applicants who do not check off transition on their recertification forms, nor provide evidence of their transition, will be dropped to a lower EMS level beginning April 1, 2016. EMT-Basics will become EMRs and EMT-Paramedics will become AEMTs.



Remember, as well, that if you wish to forego the convenience of the online recertification process, you must add an **additional** \$5 to your recertification fee if you wish to submit a **paper application**. Recertification fees for EMT and AEMT levels = \$15, and for paramedics = \$20, so you would add \$5 to this amount if you submit a paper application. ***Your application will not be processed until the correct payment is received.***
