

Central RTCC

- Re-Triage/Transfer Guidelines
 - Poster with Telephone numbers
 - MIVT script
 - Level III transfer guidelines in Orange Book
 - Being developed
- Challenges:
 - Calls to ‘Transfer Center’
 - **Orange Book**: physician to physician discussion required at level I Trauma Centers

Central RTCC

■ Data Collection

- CRTCC data dictionary updated to be consistent with 2014 NTDB data dictionary
- Data submitted to State (finally)

Central RTCC

■ TQIP

- Level 1 and 2 of the Level II's enrolled in TQIP
- Developing region-wide Geriatric Trauma Treatment Guidelines based on TQIP protocol

■ Region wide PI meeting

- Face to face
- Quarterly
 - Coordinators with monthly conference call
- OB Trauma protocol distributed

Central RTCC Challenges

■ Gaps in Care

- Merced County with UC and NO trauma center
- Met with Dept. of Health, CEO, COO
- Not in the current plan

■ General Membership Meeting

- No funding available

■ Incorporating TQIP into PI plans
